


CHILDREN'S SUMMER LIST 2020




BEN MANLEY *Albert Talbot – Master of Disguise* (32pp) **£12.99**

What is a corpse flower? How strong is a giant water lily? Discover all kinds of botanical facts from around the world. Large format (7+)


GYLES BRANDRETH *What's Black & White & Red all Over?* (288pp) **August £9.99**


LAUREN MYRACLE *This Boy* (288pp) **£7.99 pbk**
